Guests and visitors are required to pass through screening to enter the courtroom and are not permitted to enter with bags larger than 4.5 x 6.5 x 3 inches.

Security at the Judicial Center: All attorneys, guests, and visitors are required to pass through security screening to enter the Judicial Center.
