Re: Statewide Standard Citation and Reminder of BCA New Schema

The Minnesota Judicial Branch and the Minnesota Department of Public Safety announce that the Standard Citation has been updated for implementation on January 1, 2022. A complete list of changes made to the citation is posted on the Court's public website as well as the 2021 Citation version showing edits at: <https://www.mncourts.gov/GovernmentPartners/Statewide-Standard-Citation.aspx>

The new version of the standard citation will be in effect until December 31, 2023, per the biennial review process, unless there is a legislative or rule change that requires a revision prior to the two-year cycle. 
The BCA has built a new schema for eCitation vendors. The new schema is posted on the BCA Launch Pad under eCharging Specifications in the folder labeled MNJIS Interface Information. Vendors whose systems integrate with eCharging eCitations, will need to rebuild their current schema, complete testing with the BCA and State Court Administrator's Office, and then deploy the new schema to agency customers.

Agencies can switch over to the new schema any time after testing has been completed. Agencies can also choose to stay on the current schema, but at some point during 2022 the BCA will no longer support the old schema.
