- state ward for adoption (MNCIS term for child under state guardianship)
- transfer of permanent legal and physical custody to a relative
- long-term foster care (as of 8-1-12, permanent custody to the agency)
- foster care for a specified period of time (as of 8-1-12, temporary custody to the agency)
