Early Neutral Evaluation

ENE is a confidential, settlement-oriented, accelerated alternative dispute resolution process that moves families through court as quickly, fairly and inexpensively as possible.

SENE address custody and parenting time issues and involves a two-person male/female team who meets with the parties and their attorneys, if represented. The team must be made of one attorney and one child related specialist.

FENE address financial and marital issues. There is only one neutral who is an attorney or accountant with five years experience in divorce and custody matters.

-Purpose of the workshop-

At the end of the workshop participants will understand the Early Neutral Evaluation process and theory, as well as help participants learn how to conduct Early Neutral Evaluation sessions, and help parties ascertain how Early Neutral Evaluation can be implemented in their own Judicial District.


