Save time creating your divorce forms by knowing these facts BEFORE using *I-CAN!* These facts must be correct and up to date when you enter them in *I-CAN!* Some items may not relate to your case. You will NOT need to file these Worksheets with the court. If you cannot get some information about your spouse, leave it blank.

Court Cases: Are there any active court cases involving you and your spouse or the children you have together for: Legal Separation, Annulment, Divorce (other than the case you are starting now) Custody, Child Support, Paternity, Order for Protection, Harassment, Child Protection, Juvenile Delinquency, or foster care. If yes, write the Court File Number, the State and County where the case was filed, and the case type:
Copies of Court Orders: You <u>must</u> have a COPY of any court order for child support for your joint children. You <u>must</u> have a COPY of any Court Order (currently in effect) for Order for Protection or Harassment between you and your spouse or children. <u>The copy of the court orders must be attached to the divorce papers you create</u> – the copy will not be returned to you. If you do not have a copy, you must get a copy from the court where the case was filed. There is a fee for copies.
Monthly costs for medical and dental insurance you pay. \$ Contact your insurer or employer to get the cost you would have to pay per month for single coverage \$; single plus spouse \$; and family coverage.\$
Monthly costs for medical and dental insurance your spouse pays. \$ Also, get the cost your spouse would pay per month for his/her current insurance for single coverage \$; single plus spouse \$; and family coverage.\$ If this information is not available to you, leave this blank.
Monthly costs for child care (due to parents' work or school)
Public Assistance: Monthly amount received by you, your spouse or your joint children as MFIP, General Assistance, Tribal TANF or SSI \$
