

The proposed agenda may not be complete, by any means. Presumably the Commission will have witnesses from whom it wishes to hear in addition to those set forth in the Proposed Agenda.

For that reason, I thought I would also offer a list of optional witnesses, who would be able to testify on a variety of subjects in addition to those touched upon by those witnesses identified in the Proposed Agenda.

Petitioners do not contemplate that all or even a majority of these optional witnesses will be called for obvious reasons of efficiency and economy.


With all this in mind, Petitioners respectfully submit the following areas of optional testimony:

OPTIONAL TESTIMONY

- 1. COMMISSION ON STATE COURTS
 - Subject: Description of study performed on national status of broadcast and photographic coverage of state courts.
 - Comments: The results of this study are contained in a recently published book. A similar study has been prepared by the Radio and Television News Directors Association (RTNDA), and has been made available to the Commission. Thus, the author's testimony may not be necessary.

2. RTNDA VIDEOTAPE

Subject: This videotape presentation, prepared in conjunction with the A.B.A., charts the history and present condition of the use of broadcast and photographic equipment in various state courts. This is not a survey, or an exhaustive summary of the present

status of rules concerning broadcast and photographic coverage.

Time: Thirty minutes.

- 3. TESTIMONY OF REPORTERS
 - Subject: If the Commission desires, Petitioners would be able to offer testimony of reporters who would actually be operating under the guidelines. However, testimony of news directors is already anticipated under Petitioners' Proposed Agenda.
- 4. SURVEYS OF WISCONSIN EXPERIMENT
 - Subject: Although Petitioners have not yet contacted the authors, they believe that certain studies of the Wisconsin experiment have been conducted in an academic context. When and if these studies are located, Petitioners will inform the Commission.
- 5. RESULTS OF WISCONSIN EXPERIMENT
 - Subject: It is possible that several persons might be able to supply this Commission with their views of the Wisconsin experience. The possible witnesses might include Wisconsin's Chief Justice Beilfuss, Wisconsin trial court judges, members of the committee which studied the results of Wisconsin's experiment and representatives of Wisconsin's media. Petitioners have not yet spoken to any of these potential witnesses.

Obviously, transporting these witnesses to Minnesota would quickly become prohibitively expensive. Thus, petitioners would respectfully suggest that some alternative to live testimony be devised. Alternatives include the combination of written or videotaped statements with other methods of direct communications, such as direct conference telephone calls. 6. EXPERIMENTATION WITH DIFFERENT COVERAGE MODES

Subject: If the Commission desires, Petitioners would be willing to participate in experiments directed to the technical coverage aspects of the guidelines. For example, variations in the number of cameras and microphones utilized and changes in their position could be made during different sessions of the Commission hearings. In addition, it may be possible to provide live coverage of a portion of the hearings. Such experiments would give the Commission valuable experience in ascertaining the impact of the presence of cameras and microphones in a courtroom setting. This experience would be further strengthened by holding some hearing sessions in an actual courtroom setting.

7. EXPERIMENTATION WITH ACTUAL NEWS COVERAGE

Subject: It may be possible to actually demonstrate to the Commission the differences Petitioners perceive in news coverage with and without broadcast and photographic access to courts. For example, a news reporter might prepare news reports on the Commission hearings using the available broadcast technology, and prepare a report on a portion of the hearings using the methods presently available.

This list of alternative witnesses is by no means exclusive. As preparation for the hearings begins, other possibilities may well present themselves. However, in order to prepare for our meeting on September 21, 1981, I thought I would bring some of these ideas to your attention.

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



Your consideration and the consideration of the other Commission members of these matters is most appreciated.



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Dear Mr. Pillsbury:


