On July 13, 2018, the E-MACS release 2.5.1 will be implemented. This release includes new and updated features for filers using E-MACS.

New Features Impacting Filers Using E-MACS

Attorney Scheduling Conflict Dates Field

When filing the Attorney Scheduling Conflicts Notice, attorneys will now enter their conflict dates in the new Attorney Scheduling Conflict Dates field. Filers will continue to file notices using the filing type “Notice” and the filing subtype “Attorney Scheduling Conflicts.” The Clerk’s office will reject filings that come in with the wrong type or subtype.

Changes to the Court Level Menu

Filings for the court of appeals were sometimes submitted incorrectly because users were mistakenly choosing “Appeal Panel” as the court level. Appeal Panel now appears at the bottom of the dropdown as **Appeal Panel For ch. 253D Reconsideration Only** to clarify it should only be used for filings for a special panel that handles discharge or transfer petitions in certain commitment cases.

AP Filing Options Removed from Supreme Court and Court of Appeals Filing Type Menu

Filings for the supreme court or court of appeals were sometimes submitted incorrectly because users were mistakenly choosing “AP” (appeal panel) as the filing type. The AP filing type is now only available when the case type is Appeal Panel.
