**ORDER REGARDING PROPOSED AMENDMENTS  
TO THE MINNESOTA RULES OF EVIDENCE**

The Minnesota Supreme Court Advisory Committee on the Rules of Evidence has filed a report that recommends amendments to the Rules of Evidence, specifically to rules 402, 702, and 1101. The committee also recommends a new rule, 502, to govern disclosures covered by the attorney-client or work-product privileges. *See* Report and Proposed Amendments to the Minnesota Rules of Evidence, No. ADM10-8047 (filed Feb. 28, 2018).

The court will consider the committee's recommendations and the proposed amendments to the Minnesota Rules of Evidence after providing for a public comment period.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

1. Any person or organization wishing to provide written comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments to the Minnesota Rules of Evidence shall file one copy of those comments with the Clerk of the Appellate Courts, using the appellate courts' e-filing application, E-MACS, if required to do so, *see* Minn. R. Civ. App. P. 125.01(a)(1). All comments shall be filed so as to be received no later than May 29, 2018.
2. A hearing will be held before this court to consider the proposed amendments to the Minnesota Rules of Evidence. The hearing will take place in the courtroom on the

second floor of the State Capitol, Saint Paul, Minnesota, on June 19, 2018, at 10 a.m. Any person or organization wishing to make an oral presentation at the hearing in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments shall file a request to appear at the hearing, using the appellate courts' e-filing application, E-MACS, if required to do so, along with one copy of the material to be presented, with all such requests filed so as to be received no later than May 29, 2018.
