**ORDER REGARDING PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED
AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
AND THE RULES OF CIVIL APPELLATE PROCEDURE**

In orders filed on July 30, 2019, we scheduled a public hearing for September 25, 2019, to address the reports and recommendations provided by the Supreme Court Advisory Committee for the Minnesota Rules of Criminal Procedure and the Advisory Committee for the Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure. These committees have provided recommendations regarding the requirements for the use and preparation of transcripts, particularly with respect to the transcription of audio, video, or other electronic evidence. Written comments have been filed, and representatives of two organizations requested an opportunity to speak at the hearing.

Based on all the files, records, and proceedings herein,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the hearing on September 25, 2019, in the Supreme Court Courtroom at the State Capitol shall begin at 10:00 a.m. and will proceed as follows:

1. The Honorable Richard H. Kyle, Jr., chair of the Supreme Court Advisory Committee for the Rules of Criminal Procedure, shall proceed first and shall have up to 15 minutes of time to present the committee's report and recommendations.


2. The Honorable Jill Flaskamp Halbrooks, chair of the Supreme Court Advisory Committee for the Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure, shall proceed next and shall have up to 15 minutes of time to present the committee's report and recommendations.

3. Cathryn Middlebrook, on behalf of the Board of Public Defense and the Office of the Minnesota Appellate Public Defender, shall proceed next and shall have up to 10 minutes of time to present comments.

4. Anthony Bushnell, on behalf of the Criminal Law Section of the Minnesota State Bar Association, shall proceed next and shall have up to 10 minutes of time to present the comments of that organization.
