Media Resources and Information

Location and Parking:

Lakeville North High School is located at 19600 Ipava Ave. in Lakeville, MN. Media parking is available in the West Parking Lot at the rear of the school and members of the media should enter through Door #1.

Event Schedule:

Recording equipment must be in place by 8:30 a.m. The program will begin at 8:45 a.m. and oral arguments will begin at 9:00 a.m. Following oral arguments, the Supreme Court justices will return to the stage and take questions from the students beginning at approximately 10:15 a.m. Supreme Court justices will be available for interviews following the event at approximately 11:15 a.m. in the Lakeville North Media Center.

Media Opportunities:

The media is invited to attend and record the oral arguments, the question-and-answer session with students, and/or the media availability with Supreme Court justices. Please see below for information on using recording devices during the event.

Use of Recording Equipment:

The use of recording equipment during Supreme Court proceedings is subject to [Rule 134.10 of the Rules of Civil Appellate Procedure](#).

- Requests to use recording equipment during oral arguments must be submitted to the Court Information Office at least 24 hours before event. You can contact Beau Berentson at (651) 296-6043 or (651) 303-4933 or beau.berentson@courts.state.mn.us to provide notice.

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Media Resources and Information (cont.)

- All recording equipment must be in place at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the program (which begins at 8:45 a.m.).
- During oral arguments, cameras must be placed in designated areas to ensure students are able to view the proceedings. Court and school district staff will be onsite to direct the media to appropriate locations. Once recording equipment is setup, it cannot be disassembled until the oral arguments have concluded. All cameras (video and still) should be placed on a tripod and remain stationary throughout the court's official proceedings. No flashes or additional lighting should be used during the oral arguments.
- Following oral arguments, recording equipment can be disassembled and/or moved. Camera flashes are allowed during the question-and-answer session.
- Media outlets requiring audio will be able to plug into a sound board.
