

Odyssey Integration Scenario 5 Interim Conditions Notifications

Notification Events: Interim Conditions Added, Interim Conditions Modified, Interim Conditions Deleted, Interim Conditions, Expired

Sample Case: 87-CR-07-Scenario5

Defendant Name: Clanry Ogavitz (This is a made-up name; any similarity to an existing person is purely coincidental.)

XML Messages – see the accompanying messages that come out of the notification process after each step is completed in Odyssey.

A	Case initiated with one charge. Count #1 = Traffic - DWI - First-Degree Driving While Impaired; Described	Case Initiated Notification Event includes one charge element. Charge Sequence ID = 1
B	Interim conditions added as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Pay bail for 500 ▪ Anger management ▪ Attend AA (Alcoholics Anonymous) 	Interim Condition Added Notification Event includes three interim condition elements.
C	Interim conditions modified. Bail was changed to 950 (See Items F & G below)	Interim Condition Modified Notification Event includes three interim condition elements.
D	Interim conditions “Anger Management” deleted.	Interim Condition Deleted Notification Event includes two remaining interim condition elements.
E	Expiration Date as of today added to Interim Conditions. Note: User interaction is required to trigger an expiration notification. An expired notification is not automatically triggered by the system on the date of “expiration.”	Interim Condition Expired Notification includes two remaining interim condition elements.

Updating or correcting interim conditions

In MNCIS, interim condition records can either be updated or corrected.

- The clerk updates the interim conditions record as a result of a hearing or order.
 - From an integration perspective, this results in one notification message coming out – that message contains one node showing the previous interim conditions record being “expired,” and another node showing the updated interim conditions record added.
- The clerk corrects the interim conditions record if an error was made during data entry.
 - From an integration perspective, this results in one notification message coming out – that message contains one node showing the modified interim conditions record.
- Scenarios F and G below should serve to clarify what these messages will look like.

XML Messages – for interim conditions record updated or corrected.

Interim condition Sets

Interim conditions occur in “sets.” For example, if there are multiple parties on a case (say, a defendant and a witness), there can be separate condition sets on each party. Each condition set has a unique orderEventKey. The messages below demonstrate this.

H	Interim conditions added for witness Jamelze	orderEventKey = “15722826” Party Reference partyKey = “1209498”
I (See message B)	Interim conditions added for defendant Ogavitz	orderEventKey = “15722759” Party Reference partyKey = “1209516”

Deleting Interim Conditions (right-click, Delete) from the Conditions Tab “main screen” results in an Expiration notification.
