PROGRAM MISSION: The mission of the Fourth Judicial District Adult DWI Court program is to increase public safety and reduce the number of alcohol related traffic deaths and injuries by effectively partnering the justice system and community resources to focus on the specific issues of repeat DWI offenders. Between 2007 and 2016, there have been just over 620 participants in DWI Court.

In 2014, the Fourth Judicial District Adult DWI Court was selected as an NCDC "Academy Court" to provide training and guidance to other states on policies and procedures for effective DWI Court practices.
