**(PROPOSED) PROTECTIVE ORDER
 ALLOWING UNIVERSAL MUSIC GROUP
 ACCESS TO CATALOG AGREEMENT**

and

Tyka Nelson,

Petitioner.

The above-entitled matters came before the Court on _____, 2017, without a hearing.

On September 30, 2016, this Court approved the Estate entering into a recording agreement with Universal Music Group on the same or better terms as were shared with the Court in submissions leading up to a hearing on September 29, 2016. The Estate finalized the UMG Agreement on January 31, 2017.

On May 17, 2017, the Personal Representative sought the Court's approval to rescind the UMG Agreement, primarily based on allegations from Warner Brothers that its April 16, 2014 agreement with Prince Rogers Nelson (the "Catalog Agreement") conflicts with the UMG Agreement. On May 23, 2017, the former Special Administrator asked the Court to enter a protective order that allows UMG and the Heirs to see the Catalog Agreement.

The Court makes the following:

ORDER

1. In an effort to see if all principal parties can reach a resolution on the respective rights of UMG and Warner Brothers, the Court grants the request of Bremer Trust.

2. In keeping with the confidentiality provision in the Catalog Agreement and Minn. R. Civ. P. 26.03, the Court issues this protective order. The Personal Representative and former Special Administrator are permitted to share the Catalog Agreement with counsel for UMG and the Heirs identified by the Court on May 19, 2017, after redacting the consideration paid by Warner Brothers. Counsel for UMG and the Heirs may share the Catalog Agreement with their clients, but no other party without further permission of this Court, and must retain the confidentiality of the Catalog Agreement. Any violation of this protective order will be subject to sanctions.
