**ORDER ESTABLISHING COMMENT PERIOD AND  
HEARING ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE  
RULES FOR NO-FAULT INSURANCE ARBITRATION**

The Minnesota Supreme Court No-Fault Standing Committee on the Rules for No-Fault Insurance Arbitration has recommended amendments to those rules to clarify arbitrator qualifications, to provide an appeal process when discipline or other adverse actions are imposed on arbitrators, and to provide procedures to recover delinquent invoiced arbitration fees. The committee's recommendations and proposed amendments to the Rules for No-Fault Insurance Arbitration are available on the public access site for the Minnesota Appellate Courts, P-MACS, under case number ADM09-8011, in the petitions filed on October 17, 2021. The court will consider the proposed amendments to the Rules for No-Fault Insurance Arbitration after providing a period for public comment on the proposed amendments.


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Any person or organization wishing to provide comments in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments to the Rules for No-Fault Insurance Arbitration shall file one copy of those comments with the Clerk of the Appellate Courts, using the appellate courts' e-filing application, E-MACS, if required to do so. *See* Minn. R. Civ. App. P. 125.01(a)(1). All such comments shall be filed so as to be received by the Clerk's office no later than December 21, 2021.

2. A hearing will be held before this court to consider the proposed amendments to the Rules of No-Fault Insurance Arbitration. The hearing will take place in the Supreme Court's courtroom in the State Capitol, Saint Paul, Minnesota, on January 26, 2022, at 11 a.m. Any person or organization who wishes to make a presentation at the hearing in support of or in opposition to the proposed amendments to these rules shall file a request to so appear along with one copy of the material to be presented with the Clerk of the Appellate Courts, using the appellate courts' e-filing application, E-MACS, if required to do so. *See* Minn. R. Civ. App. P. 125.01(a)(1). All requests and accompanying materials shall be filed so as to be received by the Clerk's office no later than December 21, 2021.
