

## **AFFIDAVIT OF DONNA BERGSTROM**

DONNA BERGSTROM states:

1. My name is Donna Bergstrom. I make this affidavit upon personal knowledge of the facts set forth herein.

2. I am a resident of Saint Louis County, Minnesota.

3. I am the Deputy Chair for the Republican Party of Minnesota ("MNGOP"). As part of my job duties, I help recruit and support candidates to run for elected office as a candidate for the Republican Party of Minnesota.

4. The MNGOP spends substantial time and resources on recruiting and supporting candidates that seek elected office. The MNGOP through its party units endorses candidates, typically through a nominating convention. This is typically a competitive process by which multiple candidates politic to members of the Republican Party of Minnesota to obtain their support and endorsement.

5. When officials with duties regarding elections, including Governor Tim Walz, fail to follow statutory requirements by unlawfully shortening deadlines for special elections and by failing to allow for proper notice of filing periods for special elections, the Republican Party of Minnesota, its party units, its members, and its candidates are prejudiced.

6. On or about January 3, 2025, I was made aware that Allen Shen, a member of the Republican Party of Minnesota and former Republican Party of Minnesota endorsed candidate in House District 40B, was unable to file for the House District 40B special election. Shen was unable to do so because he was not in the State of Minnesota from December 26, 2024, until approximately December 31, 2024, at 9:00 PM (after the filing deadline of 5:00 PM had closed), and thus Shen was unable to seek the office currently held by Democratic-Farmer-Labor Incumbent Representative Jamie Becker-Finn.

7. I expected the Writ of Special Election to be called according to statute, and thus was not planning to finish identifying and recruiting candidates, or organizing a nominating convention until 22 days after the start of the legislative session, which is when Minnesota Election Law requires the governor to issue a Writ of Special Election when a vacancy results from a successful election contest, as was the case here.

8. Again, the unlawful Writ of Special Election was premature and the notice of the period of candidacy was less than the required number of days. The MNGOP, its members, and its candidates rely on officials to adhere to statutory requirements, especially as it pertains to timing of elections.
