Request for Order for Disclosure Instructions (Minn. Stat. §§ 491A; 550.011)

You can use the instructions below to start the financial disclosure process if all the following are true:

- Your judgment has been docketed for (a) district court 30 days, or (b) conciliation court past the stay date listed on your Order for Judgment form; and
- The judgment is not satisfied.
- 1. You'll need the following information:
 - The debtor's name and address
 - If the debtor is a business or company, you must state the name of the person responsible for the business. For example, officer, CEO, CFO, manager, etc.
 - If you are not sure which individual is responsible for the business, you can search the <u>Minnesota Secretary of State's webpage (sos.state.mn.us)</u>.
 - The district court file number.
- 2. Complete all the information on the <u>Request for Order for Disclosure form- JGM302</u> (https://mncourts.gov/GetForms.aspx?c=24&f=388).
- 3. If there is more than one debtor, you must fill out a Request for Order for Disclosure form for each debtor.
- 4. File the court forms along with a check for \$5.00 for each request by making your check payable to: District Court Administrator. You may file in person or mail the completed form and check to Civil Filing Department-Hennepin County Government Center, MC 332, 300 South Sixth Street, Minneapolis, MN 55487-0332.
- File the Request for Order for Disclosure form with the <u>Hennepin County Civil Division</u> (<u>https://mncourts.gov/Find-Courts/Hennepin/HennepinCivilCourt.aspx</u>) in person, by mail, or by <u>eFiling (https://mncourts.gov/File-a-Case/File-in-A-District-Trial-Court.aspx</u>) with the <u>appropriate filing fee (https://mncourts.gov/Help-Topics/Court-Fees/District-Court-Fees.aspx</u>) or a <u>Fee Waiver Application (https://mncourts.gov/GetForms.aspx?c=19&p=69</u>).
- 6. If approved, the Court will send you and the debtor(s) a copy of the Order for Disclosure.
