### 8. Tour Spirit Tree or Grand Portage National Monument Heritage Center 1:00

- The Spirit Tree is located 35 miles NE of Grand Marais. Also known as Little Cedar Spirit Tree or Manidoo-giizhikens, this tree grows twisted and gnarled from bare rock on the shore of Lake Superior. There are records of this tree's presence dating back over 300 years. It is considered scared by the Ojibwe Indian Tribe, who traditionally leave tobacco at this ancient tree as an offering. This site requires a band member escort. Judge Deschampe has offered to escort those interested.
- The Grand Portage National Monument Heritage Century opened on August 10, 2007 with a commitment to honor the area's history, people, and culture. The building houses exhibit galleries about Anishinaabe (Ojibwe) culture and the fur trade, American' National Parks bookstore, and multi-media programs.
