

Supervision Module 101

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Need for Supervision

- No single data management information system used by all treatment courts to collect and manage treatment court or participant data.
- Courts rely heavily on grant funding from local and national agencies.
- Some case data can be found in MNCIS, and other data is manually tracked by the TC coordinators on an inconsistent basis.
- Treatment Court Initiative (TCI) and Judicial Council have embraced moving the funding formula to include a performance-based component.



Overall Goal

- Tracking in Supervision promotes consistent reporting for all treatment courts and participants statewide, reduces the likelihood of lost information, and allows broader and consistent reporting, which supports the oneCourtMN vision.

How did we get here?

2016

Judicial Council supported the “...development and adoption of a statewide performance measurement system for drug courts and implement a statewide MIS [Management Information System] to support performance management...”

JAD approved doing an evaluation of the Supervision module for treatment court information collection

2018

Project team worked with Tyler Technologies to evaluate Supervision to determine if it would work for Minnesota

2019

JAD approved purchasing Supervision from Tyler Technologies

A new project team was created to configure and implement Supervision statewide

What is Supervision?

- A case management system within MNCIS that is designed for treatment courts
- Integrates with MNCIS so criminal case information is available within Supervision
- Data tracked in Supervision is not available in MNCIS
- Custom reports have been developed internally for treatment court operations
 - Staffing – 1 page overview of each participant for use at Staffing Meetings
 - Snapshot – Quarterly reports that show individual treatment court census data (# referrals, accepted, graduated, etc.)
 - Data Quality – Means to help treatment court coordinators and supervisors ensure data entered in Supervision is accurate

What information is collected?

- It will allow coordinators to track important information about treatment court participants and their progress within the program.
- Participants' Program Status from referral to program exit
- Drug/Alcohol tests and results
- Incentives and Sanctions
- Days of sobriety
- Referrals to other services
- Statistics at Program Entry/Exit

Definitions

Data entry expectations

- Treatment court coordinators will enter data on a weekly basis at a minimum.
- They should not wait until end of quarter to enter data.
- Treatment Court Lead Coordinators and Supervisors will use the data quality reports to monitor the data entry.
- Business Process Specialists/Coordinators will monitor data in the 1st and 3rd Districts.

Supervision Rollout Schedule

Districts 5 and 10

Training: February 10 and 12

Data Entry: February 15 – March 12

Go Live: March 15

Districts 2, 4, 7, and 9

Training: March 2 and 4

Data Entry: March 8 – April 2

Go Live: April 5

Districts 1, 3, 6, and 8

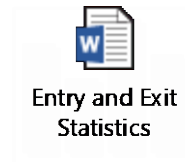
Training: April 6 - 9

Data Entry: April 12 – May 7

Go Live: May 10

Who has rights to use Supervision?

- Treatment Court Coordinators have access in MNCIS and Supervision
 - Rights limited to cases in counties that make up their treatment court
 - Court employed Coordinators – View & update rights in MNCIS & Supervision
 - County employed Coordinators –
 - MNCIS: View only
 - Supervision: View and update rights
- Business Process Specialists/Coordinators have Supervision access to be able to provide support
- Court administration staff will not have access to Supervision
- External treatment court partners will not have access to Supervision
