Security at the Capitol: Attorneys who have appeared in the case and are not themselves a party are permitted to bypass screening and bring a bag into the courtroom. Other counsel will be required to show Security a photo ID along with proof of their affiliation with the law firm or agency representing the party at oral argument prior to bypassing screening and bringing a bag in. Guests and visitors are required to pass through screening to enter the courtroom and are not permitted to enter with bags larger than $4.5 \times 6.5 \times 3$ inches.

Security at the Judicial Center: All attorneys, guests, and visitors are required to pass through security screening to enter the Judicial Center.
